### HOLY WEEK April 5 - 12

This is the week! The holiest week of the whole year, when we celebrate the three days of our Lord's passover from death to risen life. You'll want to come to church for all three of these days, from Maundy Thursday evening to Good Friday afternoon to Easter Sunday morning, as well as on Palm/Passion Sunday at the beginning of the week.

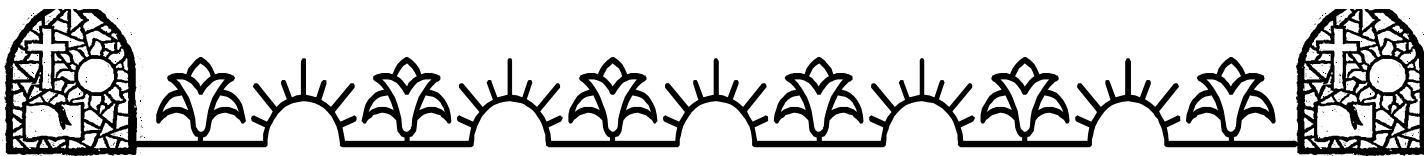
Palm/Passion Sunday on April 5<sup>th</sup> recalls both our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the unfolding week of his arrest and crucifixion. We will raise palm branches and read Mark's story of Christ's passion, as we prepare for the week ahead. Services are at 8:00 in the chapel and at 10:30 in the sanctuary, as usual.

On Maundy Thursday, the Scripture readings will help us recall the evening of Jesus' last supper with his friends. We will break the bread of the Lord's Supper remembering that somber moment. And then candle by candle the sanctuary will grow dark as Christ's ancient lament for his people is read. Both the Choir and the Handbells will be playing/singing for this service, which begins at 7:30 p.m.

The Good Friday service begins at 2:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary with 15 minutes of meditative music, featuring Lynn Moser at the organ. Surrounded by prayers and hymns, at the heart of the service will be Heinrich Schutz' *St. John Passion*, sung *a capella* by the Arizona Choir, directed by Bruce Chamberlain. The text of this work is straight from John's Gospel, the story of our Lord's betrayal, trial and crucifixion.

On Easter Sunday we celebrate with resurrection joy our Lord's victory over death in a service of Word and Sacrament. Join your voices with our choir as we sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" and break bread at the Lord's table with grateful "alleluias!"

In the Sundays of Eastertide following Easter Sunday, we will have special music from Mustard Seed (April 19), the Presbyterian Campus Ministry band (April 26), and the combined choirs of Trinity, Christ and Holy Way Presbyterian Churches (May 3).

As we conclude Lent and move through Holy Week into Easter, we hear a lot of Scripture! -- Mark's Passion story on Palm Sunday, John's crucifixion on Good Friday, the resurrection narratives of Easter. How do the different Gospel writers tell this central story of the faith? How do we understand it? Where does it touch our lives this time around?

Notice that in the Sundays after Easter, the first reading is not from the Old Testament, but from the Acts of the Apostles. We hear from the early church in these weeks right after the resurrection of the Lord, and have an opportunity to learn from their joy, their generosity, their witness, their faith.

You are encouraged to read the Scripture passages during the week as a way of preparing for the worship of God. If you can, join with others to reflect on the upcoming texts each Wednesday evening at 5:00 p.m. Each Sunday, as one text is set beside a second and a third, new insights emerge from the dialogue between them. Listen well. Ponder faithfully. Expect and hope.

## Pastor's Letter to the Congregation

**Lent is almost over. Easter is near. A season of special reflection and discipline ends; a season of glad celebration begins. Life is filled with balance.**

**So it is with Trinity these days. We've much to celebrate and much to prepare for. We must balance our vision and keep an eye on both – the things to celebrate; the things to prepare for.**

**At the last Clearness Conversation on March 22, we spent time talking about some of the newest developments at Trinity – and how important they are. There's excitement about the Compañeros program, our renewed interest in campus ministry, Project Hospitality and the Food Bank site on campus. There's appreciation for the ways monthly communion, Wednesday Nite Alive and our music ministry nurture our faith. Lots to be grateful for.**

**At the same conversation, we spent time facing the future together: recognizing the current realities of our resources and keeping an eye toward a future that we believe God knows and we're on the path of discovering.**

**The balance is to keep paying attention to both: the ministries that are important for this moment and God's vision for our future. Both are important; both are necessary; both are part of what I celebrate this Easter with you**

# Session Notes

March 23, 2009

Spring cleaning – spring housekeeping – new beginnings – whatever you want to call it, the Session was busy with all those things in March. The Session elected Leone Mohney as church Treasurer and Andrea Windsor as assistant Treasurer for 2009. They will work with Alice Smedley, the chair of the Stewardship & Finance Committee. Janet Bond, Beth Holliday and Jane Parker will be money counters for 2009. Jim Hooper and Alice Smedley were elected to the 2009 Nominating Committee, and Liz Strong and Leone Mohney were elected as 2009 Elder Commissioners to Presbytery with Carroll Keegstra and John Hill as alternate commissioners.

The Stewardship & Finance Committee asked the Session to reaffirm the general policy approved in 2008 that commits Session to use future funds from the Emerald Foundation per Frances McClelland's interests as follows: Physical improvements, continuing ministry initiatives and additions to unrestricted Session designated reserves. The Emerald Foundation grant gift for 2009 is \$400,000.00. The deficit for 2008 is approximately \$370,000.00 and Session approved using the unrestricted Session designated fund to cover that deficit.

An exciting prospect for Trinity is the approval of employing Ms. Erin Buckner from Princeton Theological Seminary for a ten-week summer internship that begins June 1. Ms. Buckner is well-traveled, educated and talented. She has experience singing with choirs, assisting with youth groups and working in the private sector. She has a family member living in the area and is excited about coming to Arizona. Her position description for working at Trinity sounds strenuous, but her past experiences indicate she will be a perfect fit. Let's look forward to her time with us.

Here's a dilemma. Organ repairs are scheduled to begin on May 11<sup>th</sup> and continue for 4 to 6 weeks. The down side is that we will miss Lynn

Moser's most excellent organ renditions. The up side is that we will enjoy Lynn Moser's most excellent piano renditions. This is a win-win situation. We will have lovely piano music for several weeks and, at the end of that time, an organ that is mostly repaired. A second phase of organ repair is planned for a later time.

The Session spent some of their meeting time reflecting about aspects of healing. Elders explored ways to nurture the healing work of God in ourselves, our church and our community. Several elements of healing were discussed in small supportive groups. Most of the groups focused on the elements of sharing, being attentive listeners, taking care of spiritual nourishment and being involved in service to others.

Take note of the new signs in the parking lots. These are designed to free up parking space for our regular members during the week. Note, too, that the AC is repaired. And you can expect improved library lighting in the future. The Session is involved in analysis of the Clearness Conversation #2, but you should know the outcome of those deliberations at the Congregational meeting scheduled for March 29<sup>th</sup>.

The Arizona Choir, the premiere choral ensemble at The University of Arizona School of Music, will perform at Trinity on Palm Sunday evening, April 5<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 p.m. The concert, entitled "Baroque Palms to Passion" will feature Heinrich Schutz' *St. John Passion* and J.S. Bach's cantata for Palm Sunday, *Himmelskonig, sei willkommen*, BWV 182. These two works will explore the events of Holy Week from Jesus' entry on Palm Sunday into Jerusalem to His arrest, trial and Crucifixion on Good Friday. The *St. John Passion* will be sung in an English translation prepared by Dr. Bruce Chamberlain, conductor of The Arizona Choir. The concert is FREE and open to the public. The Choir will perform the *St. John Passion* again as part of our worship service on Good Friday at 2:00 p.m.

UPDATE ON HNS: Last month, the Membership & Mission Committee received two visitors who brought some good news about the House of Neighborly Services. This long-standing Presbyterian mission effort in South Tucson has gone through a period of significant difficulty. Funding was being reduced by public agencies and questions were being raised about HNS's future. Last winter, another social service agency stepped forward and offered to lease the HNS facilities and assume management of the various programs: Our Family Services is well known as a reliable, forward-thinking organization helping those in need. The HNS Board, the Presbytery, and Our Family are negotiating an agreement that will continue the operation of the basic programs (youth and elderly) but will depend on Presbyterian initiative, leadership and financial support for ministry programs (such as Bible studies, chapel services, etc.).
